# Fiscal Year 2022 Impact Report

July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022

This year we were very happy to resume our Sound the Alarm Campaign after a two-year hiatus, installing free smoke alarms across Hawaii. With pandemic restrictions easing, we made homes safer at places like the Marco Polo Condominium on Oahu and the Anahola Homestead on Kauai. Our Anahola project was a first-of-its-kind partnership with DHHL. Fiscal Year 2022 was a relatively quiet year in terms of larger disasters. A Hawaii Island brushfire and Kona Low storm were the most significant events that occurred. Yet we still responded to a higher than average number of everyday incidents – almost 100, of which 87 were home fires.

Trained 22,016 people in first aid/CPR/AED




## **Location by County**


