"The greatest single crusade of mercy in all of history" is what President Franklin Delano Roosevelt called the work of the American Red Cross, when he proclaimed the very first national Red Cross Month in March 1943. President Obama echoed this sentiment when he declared March 2009 as Red Cross Month and encouraged all Americans to support the "noble and humanitarian mission of the Red Cross."

Hats Off

In Hawaii, off duty fire fighters, police, military, civil defense, and other volunteers took their Hats Off to the Red Cross and asked the public to fill their hats with donations. Friday, March 13 was our kickoff downtown at Tamarind Park including Pet First Aid & Disaster demonstrations, Lawyers Bake Sale, and massage. About 1,000 volunteers collected donations statewide on Saturday, despite flash flood warnings on Oahu and Maui. Big Isle Mayor Billy Kenoi, Fire Chief Darryl Oliveira, and Police Chief Harry Kubojiri were great sports at the dunking booth in front of KTA Superstores. Subway sandwiches donated lunch for Oahu and most of the neighbor island volunteers. While the rain kept us from reaching our fundraising goal, it didn't dampen the spirits of our wonderful volunteers, including high school Red Cross Club members who created home made signs asking for Red Cross support.

KSSK Radio-a-thon

Our first ever 14-hour Radio-a-thon gave KSSK listeners an opportunity to hear some amazing stories from disaster victims, lifesavers, volunteers, and first responders:

- Kim Delgado, a mother of 5 whose husband was deployed to Iraq, had the whole bottom floor of her Schofield Barracks home destroyed by fire 2 weeks before Christmas. With no family in Hawaii, we provided not only financial assistance, but emotional support and even Christmas toys for the kids.
- Dawn Wasson of Laie got flooded out of their home this past Winter and was grateful for the Red Cross shelter, meals, and financial support she and her family and neighbors received.
- Robert Philyaw, manager of a health club, used CPR and an AED to revive a club member who collapsed in the locker room. Robert had just taken lifesaving training from us 10 days before the incident.
- Kula, a Red Cross therapy dog who volunteers at Tripler was interviewed by Perry & Price and barked on command from his handler Rinsei Haimoto.
