On May 12th President Wilson formally dedicated the new National Headquarters of the American Red Cross Society at Washington. After the ceremony the President, with former President William H. Taft, reviewed a parade of more than 1,000 uniformed women—the first occasion, it is said, on which a President of the United States has officially reviewed a body of women forming part of a Government institution. With Mr. Wilson in the reviewing stand among others are Mr. Robert W. de Forest, Vice-President of the Red Cross, ex-President Taft, Chairman of the Central Committee of the Red Cross, Mrs. Wilson, and Major General Hugh L. Scott
