

Donor Dollars at Work in Haiti

Emergency Relief: \$66 mil

After the earthquake, ready-to-eat-meals were provided to survivors, like Etienne Radine and Louis Anouse, by the American Red Cross.

Shelter: \$173 mil

In addition to providing more permanent shelter solutions, retrofitting homes and repairing infrastructure, training has been provided to construction workers, like Aldomoro Victor (center) and Pierre-Richard Etienne, on safer building practices that will make houses more resistant to natural disasters.

Health: \$73 mil

American Red Cross has helped repair, construct and operate eight hospitals and clinics, including partial funding of Mirebalais University Hospital.

Cholera Prevention: \$25 mil

Prevention efforts include vaccinations, water purification tablets, as well as distribution of oral dehydration tablets.

Water & Sanitation: \$47 mil

We've helped ensure that families have access to clean water and sanitation systems, as well as large scale public education campaigns that encourage safe hygiene. Here, workers build a septic tank for newly built housing units in Morne Lazare, Pétion-Ville.

Livelihoods: \$48 mil
