Prevent and alleviate human suffering in the face of emergencies by mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors.


• The American Red Cross also has a mandate to educate the public about IHL.



THREE INDEPENDENT BODIES, ONE UNITED MOVEMENT









Protection of the Emblems





DISTINCTIVE **EMBLEMS**

Protective use is using the emblem as a visible sign to claim the legal protection of IHL in times of armed conflict. It should be displayed on personnel, equipment or facilities entitled to the protected status

DISTINCTIVE **EMBLEMS**

The emblems also have an 'indicative use' to identify persons, vehicles, or structures linked to the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement
