Every day, the Red Cross harnesses the very best of humanity to carry out our humanitarian mission. Our core services include:

Disaster Relief

We respond to some 66,000 domestic disasters annually, sheltering, feeding and comforting those affected.

Health and Safety

We empower more than 6.25 million people and businesses annually with lifesaving health, safety and preparedness skills.

Service to the Armed Forces

We support service members and their families during deployment and when they return home through emergency communication services, financial assistance programs, reintegration and veterans' services.

International Relief

Worldwide, the Red Cross network of more than 17 million active volunteers offers relief to vulnerable people and communities around the world.

Blood Collection

We are the single largest supplier of blood in the United States, providing more than 40 percent of the nation's blood supply.





Making an Impact Every Day

- 180 times a day, Red Cross workers help a family affected by a home fire or other disaster.
- 17,000 times a day, a person receives lifesaving Red Cross health and safety training, including emergency and first aid information from mobile app downloads.
- 965 times a day, the Red Cross provides services to military members, veterans and their families.
- 14,000 times a day, blood donated to the Red Cross is transfused to a patient.
- 371,000 times a day, a child receives a measles or rubella vaccination from the Red Cross and our partners.

Your Help Makes an Impact

- \$1 vaccinates a child against measles.
- \$5 provides one blanket for a disaster victim.
- \$20 provides two hot meals (lunch and dinner) to a disaster victim.



\$150 provides supplies to support the needs of an infant for three days in a shelter.

\$335 deploys an emergency response vehicle to a disaster operation.

\$1,000 provides food and shelter to five families for one day in a shelter.
