Red Cross Ready Communites a tale of resilience and renewal

In Texas, a new initiative is bringing hope to some of the most vulnerable communities. The American Red Cross has launched the Ready Communities Pilot Program, guided by a vision of collective resilience and a dedication to reducing human suffering.

The program is founded on the principle that we are stronger together and adopts a comprehensive strategy to address the underlying issues of poverty and vulnerability.

In the Heart of Texas, this pilot program is being implemented in the cities of Marlin and Waco. Our aim is to forge stronger community relations and promote self-reliance and resilience in the face of disasters.



Thank you to everyone, including the Waco Fire Department, the Baylor Red Cross Club, and our sponsor American Amicable, who pitched in to install 320 smoke alarms in 107 homes in Waco. Together we're making a difference!

The Waco Fire Department will continue to deliver our Home Fire Campaign by installing smoke alarms in the community.
