Texas Hill Country Chapter Highlights

Building Resilience in Medina County

The Ready Community initiative in Medina County brought together local partners to strengthen preparedness and safety across Hondo and surrounding areas.

- Trained Hondo Elementary School counselors to deliver Prepare with Pedro to young students
- Medina County Health Department staff trained in smoke alarm installation, sheltering, and disaster response
- Meals on Wheels volunteers surveyed clients and began installing alarms and distributing safety materials
- City of Hondo Library hosted a Be Red Cross Ready session in March
