A Message from the Regional Executive

As a donor of the American Red Cross of Colorado and Wyoming, your support empowers our volunteers to continually serve our community. In the face of emergencies big and small, we rise to the occasion and work tirelessly to alleviate human suffering.

Throughout our 85-county region, we responded to single-family home fires and major disasters like the Marshall Fire that destroyed more than 1,000 homes and wreaked havoc for countless people in Boulder County, Colorado. Our dedicated volunteers provided hope and facilitated emergency lodging, cleanup and wildfire kits, meals, mental and spiritual care and financial assistance.

After pausing in-home smoke alarm installations due to COVID-19, we relaunched our annual *Sound the Alarm* signature event. *Sound the Alarm* is a key part of our Home Fire Campaign. Throughout this past fiscal year, we installed 1,657 smoke alarms for vulnerable families in our region who did not have access to alarms or were not able to install alarms on their own. We know for certain that smoke alarms help save lives. Since the campaign began in 2014, we have documented 12 saved lives in Colorado and Wyoming.

Outside our region's geographic boundaries, we sent supplies and volunteers to support Disaster Relief Operations across the country, like the storms in Alaska and hurricanes in coastal communities in Florida and Puerto Rico.

In support of U.S. military members, veterans and their families, we continued to offer unwavering assistance. Whether connecting loved ones in crisis or helping veterans navigate challenges, we offered a continuum of care to our region's military families.

Alongside other Red Cross regions, we provided support for Afghan evacuees and aid to U.S. service members and veterans impacted by the events in Afghanistan.

For individuals living through the devastating crisis in Ukraine, the American Red Cross and the global Red Cross and Red Crescent network provided health care services, water and sanitation services, emergency cash and assistance with voluntary evacuations from conflict-ravaged communities.

We are grateful for all volunteers and partners who helped us fulfill this critical work.

Enclosed you will find our region's 2022 fiscal year annual report, which provides additional highlights of the many ways in which we helped our neighbors in need. As you review the report, I hope you feel a sense of pride and fulfillment about your partnership with the American Red Cross.

Our Impact

The American Red Cross of Colorado and Wyoming helps people in need every day — from responding to disasters big and small to installing lifesaving smoke alarms to delivering vital blood products when help can't wait. Over the past year, we:



Helped 1,069 households impacted by 548 disasters big and small, including wildfires and home fires. Installed 1,657 smoke alarms and made 901 households safer. Helped 796 households create home fire escape plans.



Delivered 26,753 blood component products to 13 hospitals and medical centers.



Provided 10,657 critical community services to members of the military, veterans and their families. Briefed 1,945 military members, veterans and their families about Red Cross services and programs.



Trained 82,743 people in First Aid, CPR, AED, water safety, caregiving and other preparedness courses.



As a part of the largest humanitarian organization in the world, we also help provide relief and save lives around the globe.

These services are made possible by generous financial support of donors and a dedicated corps of 1,845 local volunteers. We are proud that an average of 90 cents of every dollar we spend is invested in delivering care and comfort to those in need.

Revenue and Expenses

American Red Cross operating funds come from four main funding sources: revenues from products and services, contributions, investment income and other revenue. Total Red Cross of Colorado and Wyoming operating revenues and gains for Fiscal Year 2022 were \$16,809,875 million. Red Cross of Colorado and Wyoming total operating expenses were \$16,809,875 million.
