We also continue our local efforts in support of the nationwide Red Cross Home Fire Campaign, launched in 2014 to prevent home fire deaths and injuries. As part of this effort, our volunteers and partners provide free smoke alarm installations and provide home fire safety information through local *Sound the Alarm* events and appointment-based installations. Since the launch of the program, we have installed over **18,700 free smoke alarms** in Orange County, and made more than **6,600 homes safer**.

ROLL UP A SLEEVE TO HELP PATIENTS IN NEED

Every two seconds, someone in the United States needs blood. The American Red Cross must collect enough blood every day to meet the needs of accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease. Each day, the Red Cross needs to collect



about 12,500 blood donations and nearly 3,000 platelet donations to meet the needs of patients at about 2,500 hospitals and other facilities across the country.

The Red Cross collects, processes and distributes about 40% of the nation's blood supply. This wouldn't be possible without the kindness of volunteer donors who roll up a sleeve to help patients in need every day.

The Red Cross Blood Supply

This spring, it's critically important the Red Cross maintains a readily available blood supply for patients. With summer just around the corner, blood donations are critically important to maintain a stable blood supply. When schools let out and families set off on vacation, the Red Cross typically sees a decline in donors, often leading to a seasonal blood shortage. With no substitute for blood and no way to manufacture it, volunteer donors are essential for hospital patients in need of transfusions. The Red Cross blood supply remains vulnerable, and donated blood has a limited shelf life, so supplies must be continuously replenished to ensure sufficient inventory of blood products. Together, we can continue to ensure lifesaving blood is available wherever and whenever it is needed.

Disaster Services Hero OPERATION INDEPENDENCE

Operation Independence was a collaboration of the County of Orange, Orange County Fire Authority, local agencies and city departments, public/private partners and volunteers to deliver vaccines to all 3.2 million Orange County residents by July 4, 2021. This collaborative program helped over 70 percent of Orange County residents ages 18 and older to receive at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. The County continues to focus on delivering vaccines to the most vulnerable populations and hard-to-reach communities in Orange County.

First Responder Hero SERGEANT JOE GARCIA

Seal Beach Police Department

In May 2021, a six-year-old boy was shot in a road rage incident on the 55 Freeway. Sergeant Garcia with the Seal Beach Police Department was off duty when he noticed a silver sedan on the shoulder of the roadway and a woman holding her son. He immediately stopped his car, rendered medical aid, and stayed with the mother and son until paramedics arrived and rushed the child to a local hospital, where he later died. Since the incident, Sergeant Garcia—who has a six-year-old son himself—has remained in close contact with the mother and has provided support and compassion in the midst of unimaginable tragedy.

Gift of Life Hero HEIDI MILLER

For decades, Heidi Miller has been giving others the gift of life. Heidi began donating blood in college, and in 1991 became a bone marrow transplant donor. In 2017, she donated a kidney to a recipient who had mere months to live. Like her earlier bone marrow donation, Heidi's kidney donation made a lifesaving impact. Since then, Heidi has mentored over 120 people in need of kidney transplants and has helped match more than 40 individuals, including over 30 people who have now received their transplants. Heidi also continues donating platelets and blood. Knowing that the need is constant, she encourages others to donate as well.

Heidi's motto is "Share Your Spare!" whether this means blood, platelets, bone marrow or kidney donation.

In November 2021, Mackenzie Penrose was teaching a PE class to first graders when one of her students fell to the ground, unresponsive. Mackenzie quickly realized he had no pulse and was not breathing. She jumped into action and with the support of fellow school staff members Mariel Casilan and Lilly Aguilar, administered CPR and remained with the student until first responders arrived on scene. Doctors and first responders reported to the student's family and school staff that the child would not have survived if not for the immediate actions of Mackenzie, Mariel and Lilly.
