Enrolled over **49,000** people in Red Cross health and safety training courses

We also continue our local efforts in support of the nationwide Red Cross Home Fire Campaign, launched in 2014 to prevent home fire deaths and injuries. As part of this effort, our volunteers and partners provide free smoke alarm installations and provide home fire safety information through local *Sound the Alarm* events and appointment-based installations.

Help Prevent Home Fire Deaths and Injuries

This year's Real Heroes Awards will benefit the Red Cross Home Fire Campaign.

Home fires claim seven lives every day but having working smoke alarms can cut the risk of death by half. The Red Cross Home Fire Campaign helps save lives by installing free smoke alarms in homes that don't have them, and by educating people about home fire safety.

Through local *Sound the Alarm* events, the American Red Cross of San Diego and Imperial Counties partners with fire departments and community partners to install free smoke alarms and provide San Diego County and Imperial County residents with important fire safety education.

Since the program launch in 2014, we have installed more than **35,500 free smoke alarms** and made over **12,800 homes safer** in San Diego and Imperial Counties. In November 2021, the Red Cross of San Diego and Imperial Counties and the San Marcos Fire Department installed free smoke alarms in the home of San Marcos resident Joan Quinn (pictured here). Earlier this year, these alarms went on to save Joan's home and life when she experienced a home fire.

Nationwide, over **2.4 million free smoke alarms** have been installed and **1,366 lives** have been saved thanks to smoke alarms installed by the American Red Cross and partners through the Home Fire Campaign.

Roll Up a Sleeve to Help Patients in Need

Every two seconds, someone in the United States needs blood. The American Red Cross must collect enough blood every day to meet the needs of accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease. Each day, the Red Cross needs to collect about 12,500 blood donations and nearly 3,000 platelet donations to meet the needs of patients at about 2,500 hospitals and other facilities across the country.

The Red Cross collects, processes and distributes about 40% of the nation's blood supply. This wouldn't be possible without the kindness of volunteer donors who roll up a sleeve to help patients in need every day.

The Red Cross Blood Supply

About 62% of the U.S. population is eligible to give blood but only about 3% donates. With no substitute for blood and no way to manufacture it, volunteer donors are essential for hospital patients in need of transfusions. Year-round, the Red Cross has a constant need for blood and platelet donors. Donated blood has a limited shelf life, so supplies must be continuously replenished to ensure sufficient inventory of blood products. Blood donations remain essential to the health of communities. A single blood donation can help save more than one life. Together, we can continue to ensure lifesaving blood is available wherever and whenever it is needed.

Gift of Life Hero: Alan Lewis

Alan Lewis, a U.S. Navy veteran and Escondido resident, donated blood for the first time in February 1999. 22 years later, Alan recently reached an important milestone — his 1,000th platelet unit donation. His competitive spirit and desire to help hospital patients in need is shown through his commitment to regularly rolling up his sleeves to donate, including his biweekly triple-unit platelet donations. Alan's donations have brought help and hope to patients near and far. His platelet donations have been delivered to hospitals as close as La Jolla and as far as Guam. Over the past 22 years, Alan has helped potentially save thousands of lives.

Good Samaritan Hero: AWS1 Cale Foy

On the morning of May 2, 2021, AWS1 Cale Foy was on a trail walk with his wife and children at the Cabrillo National Monument in Point Loma when he observed a boat that had crashed offshore, with dozens of people in need of help. Rough seas presented dangerous and unforgiving conditions, but he jumped into action, using his Naval rescue training and working with another good Samaritan to identify people in the water who needed help, then swimming out to them getting them to safety. AWS1 Foy ultimately saved four lives thanks to his selfless and heroic actions.

Disaster Services Hero: Kenneth Kim, *San Marcos Fire Department*

As a Fire Inspector with the San Marcos Fire Department, Kenneth Kim knows that smoke alarms save lives. In 2018, Kenneth began working with the local Red Cross, supporting their *Sound the Alarm* program, which aims to prevent home fire deaths and injuries by installing free smoke alarms and educating community members about home fires. Kenneth has promoted the program throughout San Marcos, helping to organize *Sound the Alarm* events in mobile home parks and installing free smoke alarms for community members. Smoke alarms Kenneth installed in one home even saved the life of a resident who later experienced a fire. Thanks to Kenneth and the San Marcos Fire Department, thousands of free smoke alarms have been installed, helping to make community members safer.

Service to the Armed Forces Hero: AST1 Joshua Carlson

On January 19, 2021, Coast Guard Sector San Diego received a report of a disabled migrant vessel adrift 108 nautical miles northwest of San Diego. AST1 Joshua Carlson and his crew navigated to the 30-foot vessel, with 21 survivors onboard in immediate peril. AST1 Carlson jumped into the rough seas, swam to the vessel, and triaged and critically assessed all members, who were suffering from hypothermia and needed expedited medical evacuation. Over a period of 90 minutes, AST1 Carlson swam back and forth to the vessel through 12-foot seas. One by one, he assisted survivors into the water and lifted them into his crew's helicopter rescue basket. Through his heroic efforts, AST1 Carlson endured taxing conditions and ultimately saved nine lives.

First Responder Hero: Officer Janel Seney, San Diego Harbor Police Department

On November 22, 2021, Port of San Diego Harbor Police Officer Janel Seney observed a vehicle stopped on active train tracks, with an unconscious male in the driver's seat. Officer Seney instructed dispatch to hold all train traffic and used her baton to gain access into the vehicle. Officer Seney and a good Samaritan extracted the driver from the vehicle. The driver was in medical distress and did not have a pulse. Officer Seney performed CPR until additional first responders arrived and successfully used an AED on the driver. The driver began breathing on his own and was transported to a local hospital, where he survived, thanks to the heroic actions of Officer Seney.
