A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

When disasters strike our islands, you can count on the Hawaii State Chapter of the American Red Cross to be there, on the scene, providing assistance to the victims. Whether it's a fire in Waimanalo or a flood on Kauai, our staff and volunteers are prepared to help 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

If a hostage crisis keeps senior citizens from their needed medication, Red Cross volunteers will be there to make sure their medication is replaced and that their emergency medical needs are addressed until they can safely return home. If a house fire destroys the school supplies of a young child, the Red Cross will help the family purchase replacement items so that the child can feel secure again.

The Hawaii State Chapter of the American Red Cross has been providing food, shelter, clothing and counseling to the people of Hawaii since 1917, rendering vital services to disaster victims in every community, in every county, in the State of Hawaii. With care and compassion, we help victims get back on their feet after a tragedy. The Red Cross in Hawaii is the only local nonprofit organization that meets the needs of disaster victims any time of the day, 365 days a year. The Red Cross also works in the local community to help the public prevent emergencies and prepare for disasters.

Essential lifesaving trainings are provided through the Red Cross such as first aid, CPR, and aquatics, to enable people to help their own families, friends, co-workers and neighbors during times of emergencies. Our 40 year old free summer swim program at Ala Moana Beach Park teaches hundreds of adult and keiki how to swim, and our volunteer First Aid Station teams devoted over 1,000 hours this year at carnivals and sporting events, rendering on the scene aid, free of charge.

Rapid worldwide communication allows the Red Cross in Hawaii to bring military families together when crisis threatens their well-being and family life. Critical illness or death of a close family member is often the reason, but sometimes it is a breakdown in childcare arrangements, or to announce the birth of a new baby. This need is becoming even greater as many of our Hawaii National Guard and reserve members have been deployed to Iraq.

Because the Red Cross is not a government agency, the generosity and aloha of Hawaii's people allow us to better serve those in need throughout our islands. Our deepest thanks to our 15,000 donors for their compassionate support. Through their efforts, the Red Cross continues to respond to disasters and save lives.

THE HAWAII RED CROSS

Response Highlights

- Disaster Action Team volunteers responded to 119 disasters providing emergency assistance to 131 families including food, clothing, shelter and emotional support
- 1,547 military families relied on the Red Cross for emergency communications in times of crisis
- Dedicated and trained volunteers manned First Aid Stations at community events throughout the state and provided direct assistance to 178 persons through their efforts
- Over 11,400 members of the U.S Armed Forces and their families were provided with pre-deployment information on how to use Red Cross services to maintain connection with their families during times of crisis and separation



Preparedness Highlights

- Over 3,000 courses were conducted throughout the islands to reach 26,976 people with the information and skills to protect and save lives through the use of First Aid, CPR and Automated External Defibrillation
- Lifesaving aquatics courses were provided 8,783 persons teaching them how to protect their lives and the lives of others in and around the water
- 210 Nursing Assistants were trained to provide professional and compassionate care for the elderly and sick individuals requiring such services
- 99 youth were certified as Red Cross Babysitters
- Information on how to prepare for emergencies or hands on practice sessions were provided to 3,534 people throughout the state
- The Hawaii Red Cross has over 2,000 volunteers including 10 Red Cross Youth Clubs
