Summer 2009

For 45 years, the Hawaii Red Cross has offered free summer swimming lessons to adults and keiki at Ala Moana Beach, especially for those who might not otherwise be able to afford to learn this important lifesaving skill.

In 1914, Commodore Wilbert E. Longfellow developed the Red Cross Learn To Swim Program as part of his quest to "waterproof America" over the next 33 years. As a result, drowning rates were cut in half over this time period. Commodore Longfellow also created the National Red Cross Life Saving Corps and traveled to Hawaii to teach life guarding techniques to beach boys like Duke Kahanamoku.

Our free summer swim program is part of the Red Cross mission of saving lives. In Hawaii, 50 people drown and 150 people nearly drown every year. Drowning is the second leading cause of fatal, unintentional injuries among 0-17 year olds. The best way to prevent these deaths is to teach kids how to swim. It is a skill that must be taught because aquatic skills are not genetically inherited, but once learned, this lifetime skill will save lives. This summer, volunteer certified Water Safety Instructors taught 200 adults and 300 keiki how to swim at Ala Moana Beach. Dozens of teens also helped out in the water as part of our Summer Buddies Program.

First Aid Station Teams (FAST)

Almost every weekend, trained Red Cross volunteers set up First Aid Stations at various community events like the 50th State Fair, Honolulu Marathon, and AYSO Soccer tournaments. This life saving service is entirely volunteer-run, and provided free of charge. Mahalo to RuthAnn Kaleuati and her FAS Team for devoting over 2,000 hours a year to keep people safe. Disaster Recap

This past fiscal year (July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009), the Hawaii Red Cross and our dedicated volunteers responded to 98 disasters statewide, which is one every 3-4 days. In addition to dozens of house and apartment fires, we assisted rescue workers and victims of building and tower collapses, explosion, shooting, and Coast Guard helicopter crash. When Hurricanes Gustav and Ike pounded the Gulf Coast, 39 Hawaii disaster volunteers deployed to Louisiana and Texas where the Red Cross helped shelter 437,892 evacuees in 824 shelters, distribute 103,972 comfort kits, and provide crisis counseling to over 54,000 people. In December, major flooding in Waianae, Mililani, Wahiawa, Waialua, Haleiwa, Laie and on Kauai destroyed 14 homes, caused major damage to 40 homes, and minor damage to 172 homes. Dozens of volunteers opened 6 shelters, served over 1,000 meals, and went door to door distributing blankets and clean up kits to weary residents.
