

David W. Roe, MD, FACP, FCCP

David Roe is a lung transplant pulmonologist and intensivist at Indiana University Health Methodist Hospital, where he directs the Advanced Lung Disease and Lung Transplant Program. He's also an Associate Professor of Medicine at the Indiana University School of Medicine and was named a Top Doctor in Pulmonary and Critical Care by *Indianapolis Monthly* in 2023.

Dr. Roe spent a decade with the Indiana Donor Network, the state's organ procurement organization — first as Associate Medical Director from 2014 to 2020, then as Chief Medical Officer through 2024. The *Indianapolis Business Journal* named him a Healthcare Hero nominee in 2020, and the Donor Network's Angel Fund recognized him as Indiana's Transplant Professional of the Year in 2019. He continues to serve on the Donor Network's board and on the board of the American Lung Association of Indiana.

His research focuses on lung transplant outcomes, primary graft dysfunction, and ECMO, much of it through the NIH-funded Lung Transplant Outcomes Group, with contributions to international consensus standards in lung transplantation. He lectures regularly at national medical meetings and across Indiana — to physicians, fellows, respiratory therapists, and patient communities — and his work has been featured in *The New York Times* and on national television.

His medical training began at Southern Illinois University School of Medicine, followed by an Internal Medicine and Pediatrics residency at Michigan State University's Kalamazoo Center for Medical Studies and a pulmonary and critical care fellowship at Indiana University. He has additional executive coursework from Harvard Business School. He lives in Zionsville and has four adult children all living in the Indianapolis area.
