Al-Amin Muhammad has dedicated his life to helping others. He was born and grew up in Chicago. Early in life he became involved in drugs, gangs and crime. While serving time in prison, he realized he needed to make a life change and converted to Islam. Change was not easy, he soon found himself broke and homeless. He remained strong and refused to return to a life of crime. He was helped by a social worker, earned his GED, and became certified to run a non-profit. He became a licensed therapist, working drug and alcohol counseling. Al-Amin came to Syracuse five years ago where he recognized a need in the community. He formed an organization called "We Rise Above the Streets" that aids and provides counseling to the homeless. Along with a team of dedicated volunteers Al-Amin started Sandwich Saturdays which provides lunch bags, hygiene packages and encouragement to the homeless. Muhammad's goal is to move his organization into a permanent building to expand the organizations outreach.






**Dr. Adeline Fagan**Medical - Posthumous
