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Step 1: Logistics Planning [1 Month Prior] ☐ Reach out to your local Red Cross unit and find a contact – ideally someone involved in disaster services – that can guide you to resources that will make your event impactful and successful.			
\square Decide on a video calling platform. Examples include Microsoft Teams, Zoom, and Google Meet			
Step 2: Event Development [3 Weeks Prior] Develop activity ideas – here are some to get you started:			
Create a game about making a home fire escape plan. For the worksheet, click <u>here</u> .			

- Invite a guest speaker, such as a local Red Cross unit representative/volunteer or firefighter.
- Create a trivia game about fire safety. One recommended platform is Kahoot.
