READY RELAY

About

Ready Relay is a fundraising activity where teams of four to six youth volunteers compete against one another to complete a series of Red Cross mission-related tasks.

Purpose

Through collaboration and informative activities, you will help to raise money that will go towards funding important mission-related services, such as providing shelters for victims of disaster and restoring family links internationally.

Time Required

This event requires approximately 3 weeks to plan.

READY RELAY PLAN

Here is a detailed checklist to help you plan your Ready Relay:

Step 1: Time and location

☐ Find a public place that has a lot of foot traffic, such as a mall or a park, to host your Ready Relay event. Contact your town/city to obtain permission and/or permits to carry out your event.

Step 2: Plan the logistics

Decide on an entry fee for each team or participant, a "home base" location for participants to report back to, and a prize for the winning team. A suggested donation is \$5 per participant.

Step 3: Plan tasks

☐ Choose what mission-related tasks participants should complete for the event. A <u>task sheet</u> with example tasks is provided. Plan how to distribute tasks, such as printing them out in advance and handing them to each team captain. If team captains have phones, you may text tasks to each team captain and ask them to send proof of completed tasks in the form of pictures or videos back to you. This is great content for future social media posts to share the success of your activity.

Step 4: Promotion

☐ Use your social media account or your region's newsletter, put up flyers around school, and make a school-wide announcement to get the word out. You may also print out sign up sheets and create an RSVP form on Volunteer Connection to share with participants. Ask people to sign up on teams of 4-6 participants. Encourage them to get creative with their team names!

Step 5: Host the event

☐ Have everyone begin from one designated spot, where you will distribute the first task. Continue distributing tasks until teams have completed all tasks and a winner is determined.

Would you know what to do if your clothes were on fire?

Having emergency contacts established is an easy first step to ensure that you're ready for a disaster.

Have five people fill out a Red Cross Emergency Contact Card.



Finding a creative way to tell the Red Cross story can help us reach new people.

Write a short, eight-line Red Cross rap or song. Video yourself performing it with someone.



The Red Cross is dedicated to supporting our service men and women.

Find a veteran and thank him or her with a high-five or by calling and/or sending a text message.



The Red Cross helps educate people on International Humanitarian Law and the rules of war.

Have a friendly thumb war with someone from around the area.



Did you know nearly 40 percent of the nation's blood supply comes through the Red Cross?

Find someone who is blood type O negative, which is the universal blood type, and explain to them the importance of donating blood.
