
Latest from Youth Leaders

Happy April, Red Crossers! Are you interested in serving on a team of youth and young adult leaders from across the country to advocate and support youth volunteerism in the American Red Cross? Apply to the <u>National Youth Council!</u> Through this group, you will have the opportunity to create volunteer resources, host educational events, and liaise with diverse youth leaders. All volunteers between the ages of 16-22 who have been a registered Red Cross volunteer for at least a year are eligible to apply.

The application is composed of three components: a Microsoft Form (with Resume and Personal Response), a Red Cross recommendation form, and non-Red Cross recommendation form. We strongly advise you to begin crafting your application early so that you have ample time to think about and edit it. We will also be hosting a Crash Course Call about National Youth Council applications on April 17 at 7:00 p.m. ET if you want to gain more insight into the process.

The deadline to submit all application materials is Friday, May 13, 2022 at 11:59 p.m. ET. Please email ariana.deng@redcross.org for any questions or concerns. Good luck to everyone applying!

Measles and Rubella Initiative

Measles is one of the most contagious and severe childhood diseases. Every day, it takes the lives of hundreds of children around the world. Even if a child survives, measles can cause permanent disabilities, such as blindness or brain damage. The risk is great in developing countries where there is a prevalence of malnourishment and limited access to health care.

With the last week of April declared as World Immunization Week, take the time to learn and research Red Cross' Measles and Rubella Initiative (M&RI). The M&RI aims to achieve a world without measles and rubella by supporting countries to raise coverage of measles, rubella and other vaccines; fund, plan, implement and monitor quality supplementary campaigns; investigate outbreaks and provide technical and financial support for effective outbreak response, propose and participate in solutions to strengthen immunization delivery; and support a global laboratory network for measles and rubella. Since 2001, the Initiative has supported 88 countries to deliver more than 2.9 billion doses of measles vaccine, helped to raise measles vaccination coverage to 85% globally, reduced measles deaths by 62%, and has invested more than US \$1.2 billion in measles and rubella control activities.

Srijan Oduru is a senior at Green Hope High School and is the Field Ambassador for the Eastern North Carolina Region. Though there were many active and successful clubs in his region, Srijan took note that there wasn't an available platform where various clubs could actively collaborate with one another.

As such, Srijan took charge and founded a Youth Leadership Conference Series in order to streamline national and regional outreach throughout his region. In a recent YLC series, Srijan highlighted the importance of volunteer recognition and celebration, and he plans on showcasing upcoming topics on how to increase engagement and transitions between high school and college roles.

For anyone interested in creating a similar initiative, Srijan suggests establishing "a strong support system of volunteers and adult leaders," in order to ensure that the "process becomes more rewarding and beneficial for everyone involved." He states that, "sending emails, checking in with and talking to other volunteers, and leading the meetings takes a lot of extroversion and dedication, but it's 100% possible and worthwhile."
