In 2024, the Tiffany Circle celebrated 17 years as a premier women's philanthropic collective, contributing more than \$245 million to the lifesaving mission of the American Red Cross since its inception. Thank you for your partnership on our journey as we realize our vision of the Red Cross as a leading charity of choice for women.

Last year alone, Tiffany Circle members went above and beyond in so many ways, leading local efforts in community blood drives, assembling kits to be delivered to military families, deploying as volunteers in communities impacted by disasters and more. The different ways and the extent to which Tiffany Circle members give of their time, talent and treasure are truly remarkable. All of this work has helped us make great progress toward our current two-year strategic plan (FY24–FY25). Below is an update on our progress as of Dec. 1, 2024.

first female Chairman of the American Red Cross, and her contributions at the local, national and international levels will impact the Red Cross for generations to come.

Tiffany Circle International Council Geneva Forum 2024: A Journey of Humanity



American Red Cross Tiffany Circle members and staff toured the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Museum in Geneva

In October, over 140 Tiffany Circle members and friends representing 20 countries around the globe gathered in Geneva for the International Council Forum: *A Journey of Humanity*. Attendees were inspired by the outstanding humanitarian work of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).

Forum attendees heard from a variety of speakers, including Kate Forbes, President of the IFRC, the second woman to hold that position, and a panel of female National Red Cross and Red Crescent Society Presidents, who shared key initiatives and successes from their respective societies.

Representatives from both the ICRC and the IFRC shared how they are working together to meet the growing humanitarian needs in the world—from International Humanitarian Law (IHL), rules that seek to protect people's lives and limit their suffering, to improving technology to transform Red Cross Red Crescent response with cutting-edge tools that are shaping the future of humanitarian aid.

The Forum concluded with a gala, where Australian Red Crosser and 2017 Florence Nightingale Medal Recipient Ruth Jebb shared her personal account as an armed conflict volunteer, providing critical help and hope as a nurse in Gaza amidst the ongoing conflict and humanitarian crisis.

The vision of the Tiffany Circle International Council (TCIC) is to broaden the recognition and strengthen the support of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, its mission and fundamental principles as the leading humanitarian organization in the world. In 2020, the TCIC created a Global Outreach Workgroup to further focus on outreach to Red Cross national societies that might consider forming their own Tiffany Circle and explore international networks of existing Tiffany Circle members to engage prospective members.
