# BONNIE MCELVEEN HUNTER RECEIVES THE INAUGURAL BONNIE MCELVEEN HUNTER GLOBAL HUMANITARIAN AWARD AT THE 64<sup>TH</sup> INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS BALL

Celebrating her 20 years of extraordinary leadership as Chairman of the American Red Cross Board of Governors, Bonnie McElveen Hunter was honored with the first **Bonnie**McElveen Hunter Global

Created by the Tiffany Circle International Council, this award is presented to a Tiffany Circle member who exemplifies the humanitarian mission of the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement and who represents a spirit of dedicated global leadership, volunteerism and community.

Bonnie is the first woman to serve as Chairman since American Red Cross founder Clara Barton, and her impact during her tenure is beyond measure, from leading governance reforms to co-founding the Tiffany Circle and empowering its global leadership, as well as reengaging the organization in international relief work around the globe. It is with heartfelt gratitude that we celebrate her visionary leadership, which is a source of inspiration to all of us.

Filled with gratefulness, Ambassador Bonnie McElveen Hunter shared, "The Red Cross was founded by women and enjoyed women's leadership. Nothing better exemplifies that leadership than the 'sisterhood' of Tiffany Circle. We celebrate our belief in each other, the power of personal courage, the nobility and necessity of service, and the sanctity of family. It has been my privilege for the last 20 years to be Chairman of the American Red Cross, and while our paths may now diverge, this is not a final farewell but a new chapter in our journey together as I proudly carry you in my heart forever."
