We are excited to share that on June 30, 2024, we successfully closed the first fiscal year of our current <u>two-year strategic plan</u> (FY24-FY25) with incredible strides, including the following highlights:

- Over 1,275 members strong, we collectively contributed more than \$36 million and influenced an additional \$18 million in donations.
- Members recorded over 45,000 volunteer hours in Volunteer Connection through fiscal year 2024.
- Since our founding in 2007, we have raised over \$230 million in support of the American Red Cross, helping fulfill its lifesaving mission of preventing and alleviating human suffering in the face of emergencies.

Thank you for your incredible and unwavering commitments to realize this collective impact.

Looking ahead, we need your help to meet our ambitious goal to grow our membership to 1,350 by the end of fiscal year 2025 (June 30, 2025). The Red Cross has launched a bold initiative to expand the impact of Women in Philanthropy and make the Red Cross a leading charity of choice for all women. Illinois Tiffany Circle Learns Lifesaving Skills

Earlier this year, **Linda Nolan** and **Aileen Blake**, of the Illinois Tiffany Circle Steering Committee, graciously hosted a Hands-Only CPR Training at the Northern Trust Global Conference Center in downtown Chicago.

During the session, attendees learned that more than 350,000 cardiac arrests occur annually outside of hospital settings and that prompt administration of Hands-Only CPR significantly enhances survival rates. More than 30 current and prospective Tiffany Circle members participated in this training, gaining essential lifesaving skills. The event motivated attendees to share their knowledge with their networks and encouraged them to get fully certified.

The Park Fire: A Community United in Crisis

The Park Fire began on July 24, 2024, near Chico, California. High wind

gusts fueled the explosive growth of the fire, which grew to become the fourth largest in the state's history. Mandatory evacuations were ordered for tens of thousands of residents in Butte, Shasta and Tehama counties, prompting the rapid establishment of Red Cross — and county-managed shelters.
