



Dear Tiffany Circle Members,

As we near the completion of the second year of our 2023 Tiffany Circle Strategic Plan, we are pleased to share that we are on track for one of

the most successful periods in Tiffany Circle fundraising history. Your focused efforts on strengthening the American Red Cross mission, paired with the tremendous generosity from our Tiffany Circle members, has shone brightly through extraordinary and unprecedented times as we have navigated a global health crisis over the last two years. During this period, the Red Cross has responded to more frequent and intense natural disasters, the critical call for voluntary blood donation as we experienced nationwide shortages and the ongoing challenges faced by military families. Most recently, the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine has touched our hearts. As conflict continues, the global Red Cross network is providing around-

the-clock support, care and comfort to help people who have been

displaced by this devastating situation. Across many countries in Europe,

the global Red Cross network is working tirelessly to provide emergency

aid to people seeking safety and to improve conditions for those in harm's way. In the U.S., we were delighted to participate as spokespersons for the launch of the Sound the Alarm home fire safety campaign. Home fires claim seven lives every day in the U.S.—but having working smoke alarms can cut the risk of death by half. Last month, the Red Cross rallied volunteers to install more than 45,000 free smoke alarms in select cities nationwide as part of our Sound the Alarm events. Since its launch

in 2014, smoke alarms installed through this program have helped save over 1,330 lives. Looking to the future, as increasingly frequent and extreme weather disasters caused by climate change threaten millions of people each year, the Red Cross is planning and beginning to adapt our mission to help meet growing needs. The organization's goal is to help ensure vulnerable people and communities can better cope with the potentially

catastrophic results of this climate crisis. Lastly, we are pleased to share that our Tiffany Circle National Council convened at our national headquarters this spring. For more than two years, our Council has met virtually on a regular basis to continue our commitment to sustaining and growing our incredible Tiffany Circle. Our membership is nearing 1,200 women strong, and with the opportunity to gather safely in the months ahead, we have confidence in realizing an exceptional finish to our three-year strategic plan. Thanks to all of you

who have taken the journey with us over the last two years.
