



Happy New Year, everyone! Our Mission team is stepping into 2026 with energy, hope, and deep commitment to the work we're doing together.


We are excited to continue expanding the Centennial Campaign and to officially welcome our newest program community, the **City of Alvin, TX!** We know they are going to hit the ground running.


Thank you for your continued collaboration, for keeping your reporting on track, and for your timely invoicing—it makes a real difference in how effectively we can support you.

We are incredibly proud of the work we're accomplishing together and look forward to helping you equip your communities with knowledge and skills that can save lives.



Make a New Year's Resolution to Report Your Outreach



Empowering Youth to Save Lives: Mission CPR in Indian River County

Indian River County Parks, Recreation, and Conservation is a proud participant in the **American Red Cross Mission CPR** initiative. When introduced to Mission CPR, I was eager to get involved and help bring this life-saving mission to our community. I, Katie Marleau, the Venue Manager of the Gifford Aquatic Center, along with Head Lifeguard Leilani Boom and Lifeguard, Oddy Vasquez, share a deep commitment to safety and to serving the people who live and play in our community.

On October 16th—World Restart a Heart Day—our safety team seized the opportunity to connect with local students at the Gifford Youth Achievement Center (GYAC), a non-profit dedicated to providing education and life-enhancing opportunities for school-aged children. Being part of the same complex has enabled us to cultivate a strong, collaborative partnership with GYAC, grounded in shared values of education, safety, and community service.

We recognized that the students could play a vital role in expanding CPR education throughout Indian River County. Their Youth Services Director enthusiastically supported our idea to train several high school students as hands-only CPR presenters. He agreed that this opportunity would benefit the students by enhancing their public-speaking skills, strengthening their résumés, and offering meaningful volunteer experiences for college applications. All while teaching others this life-saving skill!

Five students successfully completed the presenter training. In the new year, we plan to reconnect with them and provide mentorship as they teach their first hands-only CPR courses to younger students at GYAC. From there, we plan to support them in communicating with their high school principals to gain permission to expand their outreach within their schools. Our long-term goal is to create a pathway through which every high school student in Indian River County receives at least one opportunity to learn the life-saving skill of hands-only CPR and encouraging full CPR certification.

To Do: 2026 Learn-to-Swim Facility Enrollment

Learn-to-Swim Facility enrollment for 2026 opened at the beginning of December and continues through the coming year. Water Safety Instructor® Trainer Academies

Interested in attending an academy? Start by reviewing the [Instructor Trainer Qualifications](#). If you meet the requirements, submit your application.

Approval usually takes about 1-2 weeks. Once approved, your eligibility to reserve a spot is valid for one year. Apply early—enrollment closes one month before the academy start date.
