### **DMV** Workers in the Nebraska and Southwest Iowa Region Recognized

Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) examiners Brad Dietlin and Matt Shields helped save the life of fellow DMV tester Tom Lewiston.



Lewiston was on a drive test when he experienced cardiac arrest. The applicant smartly returned to the DMV office, where Dietlin and Shields rushed out to begin CPR. Lewison later nominated his colleagues for the Certificate of Extraordinary Personal Action, saying, "Nominating Brad and Matt for this award was a great way to say thank you, and I would have died if not for their heroic acts." used when it's least expected, particularly at work. On January 22, 2022, Rudy Garrido, Viola Dinkins and Sandra Deaver were outside their workplace when they spotted a woman in the throes of a drug overdose. Dinkins and Garrido administered three doses of



naloxone, to no avail. In the meantime, Deaver called 911. The operator directed the trio to administer another dose. When the victim remained unresponsive, Garrido started CPR and prepared to use the AED. Just as the AED began its initial assessment, the victim responded. Paramedics arrived shortly thereafter to take over the scene. For their heroics in applying what they learned in Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED training, the trio was awarded the Certificate of Merit. #### to receive life saving awards Citizen (Iowa City, lowa), August 24, 1978 Delbert Gehrke, assistant director of recreation services at the University

of lowa (UI), heard a loud crack of lightening and assumed a building by the running track had been hit. He and his colleague, Jim Cooley, quickly

learned that the lightening had struck UI professor Bradley Loomer while he was jogging. After instructing others on the scene to get the athletic trainers and call 911, Gehrke and Cooley headed out to the track where they found the downed professor without a pulse or heartbeat. "The trainers [Holly Wilson, Scott White and John Streif] took over when they arrived," Gehrke explained, "and it was after they got started that I first felt a pulse in Loomer." For their efforts saving Loomer's life on July 20, 1978, the two employees and the three trainers received Lifesaving
